A partner in a law firm previously authorized by the Board of Education to serve as outside counsel has announced that he is leaving that firm and creating a new firm, Taylor Law Group LLP. The Committee agreed to recommend this addition by resolution to be adopted at this month's meeting.

A decision has been issued by the Office of Administrative Law (Hon. Kimberly A. Moss, A.L.J.) in the matter of *Friends of Team Charter School, Inc. v. Newark Board of Education*, granting the Board's motion for summary decision, denying Friends of Team's similar motion, and dismissing the petition filed by Friends

of Team, challenging the Board's lawsuit against that party and others, which is currently pending in the Superior Court of New Jersey. More specifically, the administrative law judge ruled, as a matter of law that the filing of litigation pertaining to Maple Avenue School was not a school facilities matter requiring Board action and NJDOE school facilities approval. A copy of the decision will be placed in each Board member's folder for their information.
