# The Finance Committee convened for its monthly meeting on Thursday, August 19, 2021, at 5:31 pm. All

Committee Members listed above were in attendance. The meeting began with School Business Administrator, Valerie Wilson introducing Krystle Whitlock, Assistant School Business Administrator of Operations.

SBA Wilson discussed the agenda items as reflected in the posted minutes. During this meeting, the committee members were able to discuss detailed information in regards to finance and operations, donations, and grants. The Committee discussed purchasing self-insurance for Medical, Prescription Drug, Dental, and all Health Care benefits along with the Wellness Fund. The District encourages staff and employees to take preventative measures to lower health care costs. District Field trips for schools are still on hold as recent Covid-19 restrictions are being reviewed. Professional Development trips are in progress for board members, superintendent's conferences, and professional development training. The District is responsible for distributing state aid to non-public schools that are currently functioning, and the aid is based on enrollment. Transportation bids for special education students were discussed highlighting timelines, bid openings etc. The Bilingual/Bicultural program and its impact on students and staff in the District was discussed.
