Meeting Summary

Committee Chairperson Dawn Haynes commenced the PESL Committee Meeting at 5:35 pm, Monday, June 10, 2024. The meeting began with New Business:

Assistant Superintendent Granato introduced the following

• A new Director of Mentoring position has been created. Partial funding of 60,000 will come from the NJDOE Community Projects Award/Senator Cory Booker. The remaining funding will come from the District to pay the salary of this new position. The salary will be based on the CASA contract.

Edwin Mendez, Director of Attendance reviewed the attendance for the month of May. He announced that May was the number 1 month for the 23-24 School Year thus far regarding the "rarely absent category" with 74% of students districtwide being rarely absent.

Rashon Dwight, HIB/Title 9 Coordinator presented May HIB data and informed the committee of the following:

Michelina Thornton, Director of Federal Grants and Parent Engagement provided the following updates:

 Parenting Partners Cohorts are in graduation season. 12 schools have used their commitment to family engagement and have begun to hold their powerful key to educational success. The 2023-2024 cohorts are continuing to see results from this parent capacity-building program they participated in and have increased parent leaders in their schools. Proud parent effective leaders are producing more successful students.

• Title I Annual School Plans

The District expectation is for each school to have at least 2 parent workshops per month. The goal is for these workshops to impact student learning outcomes. The workshops are created to align to the Priority Needs and SMART Goals in the ASP. The Title I Parent Engagement funds are used for workshop services and materials that support the school's SMART Goals.

• Back to School Event - August (*Date TBD*)

In alignment with the District's Strategic Plan and equity statement, the Back-to-School event will be at Hawkins Street School. The Parent Engagement Team welcomes all organizations (space permitting) to be part of the event and provide resources to families.

Mary Leigh Harvey, Director of Student Life presented the following:

Vulcans Jr. Firefighters' Pipeline Initiative

- The Office of Student Life partnered with the Mayor's Office and the Vulcans Jr. Firefighters Pipeline Initiative and hosted over 70 high school seniors to introduce them to careers as firefighters with the Newark Fire Department.
- Seniors participated in a presentation, walkthrough of the training facilities and live demonstration of the fire truck apparatus
 use.

CARA Bridge Liaison Training at Rutgers University

 On May 20, 2024, Newark City Learning Collaborative (NCLC) provided training to 16 School Counselors identified as CARA Bridge Coach Liaisons in order to support College Bridge Coaches supporting high school seniors with their post-secondary planning.

NJ LEEP

NJ LEEP is a college access and success program that operates after-school, Saturday, and summer programming to support
students in going to and graduating from college. NJ LEEP programs seek to offer students the opportunity to develop both their
hard academic and social-emotional skills. NJ LEEP will recruit, enroll, and serve NPS students in the 11th grade from East Side
High School and Central High School. (Schools were selected based on data of college, scholarship, and FAFSA/NJAFAA
completion rates.)

Homeless/Displace McKinney Vento -

- June 8th McKinney-Vento Family Resource Day. In collaboration with the Family Assistance Resource Center, OSL delivered a personalized, free shopping experience to 56 Families.
- Student Assistance Coordinators On May 20 & 21 SACs provided classroom presentations for Ann Street and Belmont Runyon. During the visitation, SACs conducted 26 workshops and provided valuable information about substance abuse law, vaping, marijuana and fentanyl to over 569 students
