


Defining Absence Categories

Rare	0% ≤ r < 5%	0 - 0.5 days	0 - 2.5 days
Frequent	5% ≤ r < 10%	1 - 1.5 days	3 - 5 days
Chronic	10% ≤ r < 18%	2 - 3 days	5.5 - 9.5 days
Severely chronic	r ≥ 18%	≥ 3.5 days	≥ 10 days

Overall Absenteeism by Month




Average Daily Attendance Rate


Absenteeism by School: North SLT


Absenteeism by School: South/West SLT





Absenteeism by School: Specialized Schools








School budgets have increased as a result of aggressive budget management and additional state aid which directly benefits schools and academic programs.

Note: The table above includes the General Fund and a portion of Special Revenue Fund budgets. The Special Revenue Fund also includes additional funding for student programs. In FY22-23, NPS Federal Funding is \$143.9M and includes funding for Pre-K programs (State and federal \$105.2M), IDEA (\$10.0M) and other Title and School Improvement funds (\$34.7M).
